An ecosystem of lagoons and billabongs covering around 80 hectares, Wonga Wetlands is a haven for wildlife and a mecca for birdwatchers, photographers, bushwalkers and families.
Lake Hume	Riverina Highway, Lake Hume	At six times the size of Sydney Harbour, this is a must on your to do list when in Albury Wodonga. Fishing, sightseeing and boating are some of the more popular activities available. If you are a keen photographer, check out the viewing platforms offering spectacular scenery.

Huon Hill Parklands

At 428 metres above sea level, Huon Hill lookout provides sensational views across the Kiewa Valley, the Victorian alpine region, Lake Hume and the cities of Albury and Wodonga. A number of walking tracks of varying length allow the energetic to explore.

Wagirra Trail and Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk

Jump on the Wagirra Trail and Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk and enjoy a leisurely walk along the banks of the Murray River. The Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk shares the stories of local Aboriginal artists and their connection to 'the River', told through the sculptures and interpretive boards. The trail joins the South Albury Trail at Union Bridge and follows the Murray to Wonga Wetlands (7.5km one way). The energetic can cross over Union Bridge into Wodonga and follow the river's edge into Wodonga's Belvoir Park (approximately an additional 7km).
